Welcome from the Director of Music

Welcome to this evening's concert "A Concert of Psalms" featuring Leonard Bernstein's dynamic work Chichester Psalms.

Countless composers set texts from the Book of Psalms to music. From seeking God's mercy (Have mercy upon me, O God, after thy great goodness) to suffering (Why art thou so heavy, 0 my soul?), to cursing the cause of the suffering (Corrupt are they, and become abominable in their wickedness: there is none that doeth good), to praise (O praise God in his holiness: praise him in the firmament of his power) the 150 Psalms cover a vast range of the human condition. This evening, we hear this creativitu in works by Purcell, Bloch, Brahms, Vaughan Williams, Mathias, Mozart, and Elgar. ultimately leading to our featured work by Bernstein.

Chichester Psalms is a three-movement work commissioned by the Dean and Chapter of Chichester Cathedral for the 1965 summer choral festival combining the choirs of Chichester, Salisbury, and Winchester Cathedrals. Dean Walter Hussey wrote to Bernstein: 'Many of us would be delighted if there was a hint of West Side Story about this music.' Bernstein did not disappoint. Much of the music came from Bernstein's sketches of a musical version of The Skin of our Teeth by Thornton Wilder, but that musical never eventuated, and Bernstein adapted that music to be used for Chichester Psalms. The English texts of The Skin of our Teeth were replaced by portions from Psalms 108, 100, 23, 2, 131, and 133 in Hebrew making for a stirring and dramatic three-movement suite. The work was first performed in New York on 15 July 1965 with the composer conducting the New York philharmonic. The first performance in the setting for which it was intended was on 31 July 1965 in Chichester Cathedral.

Christchurch City Choir warmly invites you to our next concert on 3 August in Christ's College Auditorium, featuring Will Todd's Mass in Blue. This is a six-movement setting (of the Latin Mass) set in the jazz idiom, accompanied by piano, bass, and percussion, and provides a refreshing take on the familiar texts of the Mass ordinaries.

Rounding out the year, Last Night of the Proms on Saturday evening 9 November and our annual performance of Handel's Messiah on Saturday evening 7 December. Both concerts are in Christchurch Town Hall with Christchurch Symphony Orchestra and are annual favourites of the people of Christchurch. Other events this year include participating in the city-wide annual Singfest on 21 September and singing carols for the Christmas season on 14 December.

I do hope that you are enriched by this evening's performance and trust you will hear the contemporary relevance of these ancient texts skilfully performed by Christchurch City Choir.

Throughout high school he worked his way through the percussion grades and completed his ATCL diploma in year 13 (2021). 2021 was also the first uear Ciaran auditioned for the National Youth Orchestra which led to one of the most amazing orchestral experiences of his life so far, playing side by side with the NZSO. In 2023 he had his first professional orchestral experience playing with the Christchurch Symphony Orchestra, for "Last Night of the Proms' with the Christchurch City Choir. Ciaran is now in his 3rd year of studying at the University of Canterbury under Prof. Justin DeHart and hopes to have a career playing in professional orchestras around the world.

Helen Webby

Harp



Born in Whangarei, Helen's passion for the harp began at the age of 12 when her older brother Kim built her an instrument. She studied Concert Harp in Auckland, Holland and Germany and in 1996 completed her master's degree from the Hochschule for Music in Hamburg. Since 2000, Helen has been Principal Harp with the Christchurch Symphony Orchestra and also plays with the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra as well as other orchestras. She premiered New Zealand works at the 2006 American Harp Society Convention and also tours with Chamber Music New Zealand, and Arts On Tour NZ.

Helen loves to take her harp out of the orchestra and on the road, where she can share the music and stories related to this magical instrument. On her latest Arts On Tour NZ tour in September, she toured New Zealand's 'top towns', with her solo program 'Pluck!'. Helen's solo CD Pluck was nominated for Best Classical CD in the 2013 Music Awards, and made in to a DVD film 'Harps Make Fine Companions', screened recently by Television New Zealand.

Helen plays the Concert Grand, made out of South Island red beech by her brother, well known harp maker Kim Webby.

Jeremy Woodside



Organ

Jeremy was born in Christchurch, New Zealand, and his musical life began as a chorister at Christchurch Cathedral; he was later Assistant Organist. He has held organ scholarships at Wells Cathedral and Westminster Abbey and has directed and accompanied many choral societies and choirs.

In 2011, Jeremy directed the Cathedral Choir for the National Memorial Service in Hagley Park following the February earthquakes, in the presence of HRH Prince William. He also gave a number of solo recitals throughout Europe to raise money for the cathedral's appeal and has released three solo CDs on the ChristChurch Cathedral organ.

Jeremy graduated as a Bachelor of Music (First Class Honours) from the University of Canterbury, and while there was awarded the Lilburn Prize for composition and Madrigal Prize for Excellence in Vocal Music. Later he completed a Masterin Organ Performance at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music. In August 2013, he gave the inaugural recital at the Transitional Cathedral in Christchurch.

Transitional Cathedral in Christchurch. His organ tutors have included Daniel Moult, Thomas Trotter and David Briggs, and Jeremy gained his Fellowship in Organ Performance from Trinity College, London in 2009, and holds an Associate Diploma from the Royal College of Organists. As a recitalist/accompanist, he has performed in many major UK cathedrals, St George's Chapel Windsor, Malvern Priory, St Andrew's Cathedral Sydney, Notre-Dame in Paris, as part of the International Organ Summer Festival in Rome. Esplanade Singapore as part of Tapestry: a festival of sacred music, and the Musikverein in Vienna.

From September 2015 - March 2018 Jeremu was Head of Keuboard and Organist at Repton School. Jeremy regularly performs with the Christchurch Sumphony Orchestra, both as a soloist, accompanist. and choir orchestral player. He is an active composer with various pieces being published by the RSCM, SOUNZ and Crescendo Music Publications in Melbourne. Australia. is the current Assistant Music Director for the Christchurch City Choir and a repetiteur for Toi Toi Opera.

Dr John Linker is Director of Music at Christ Church Transitional Cathedral (appointed 2014) where he leads the oldest musical entity in New Zealand, the Christ Church Cathedral Choir. John is also Music Director for Christchurch City Choir (appointed 2016), Canterbury's premiere symphonic choral ensemble. Both the Cathedral Choir and the City Choir are integral to the religious, artistic, and musical life of the Canterbury region, and provide cultural stability in the everchanging landscape of Christchurch.

A native of Princeton, Illinois, USA, John holds music degrees from Northern Illinois University (Bachelor of Music), Chicago Musical College at Roosevelt University (Master of Music), and University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music (Doctor of Musical Arts).
